County Clerk Increased Revenue for the County

- County Clerk's Office Revenue collection for FY 2023 \$8M.
- Recovered revenue from past due fines to date over \$377,760+.
- Under budget every year of tenure.



County Clerk Increased Customer Satisfaction

- Expedited services offered for Vital Records with dedicated staff to fulfill orders.
- Opened to the public on Saturday for special service events. Birth Certificate and Thank-A-Veteran Events held on April 13th at the Travis Building and July 20th at the Sugar Land Annex. Participated in Pct. 2 & Access Health's Back to School Event on August 3rd.
- Instructional videos made available on the County Clerk's website featuring topics that are frequently asked questions.
- Made iPads available with LanguageLine to provide Sign Language to customers who need it. LanguageLine is also available via phone, with a licensed translator for over 240 languages.



County Clerk Programs & Accomplishments

- Awarded Public Official of the Year for 2023 from the University of Houston Master of Public Administration (MPA) program.
- Co-Hosted the County and District Clerks' Association of Texas Region 7 2023 Fall Conference.
- Co-Hosted the County and District Clerks' Association of Texas site visit in 2024 in preparation for the 2025 CDCAT Summer Conference, which is set to bring 350+ clerks to Sugar Land.
- Opened Sugar Land Annex in August 2024 and cohosted a Grand Opening of the building with Precinct 4 Elected Officials.
- Held the third annual Buddy's Buddies Summer donation drive, designed and hosted by the County Clerk's 2024 Youth Employment Program Interns – 'Be A Hero' themed. Collected over two truck loads of supplies benefiting Fort Bend County Animal Services.

When veterans file their DD-214 discharge documents at the County Clerk's Office - Travis location, they will be provided with a free ID card* that will allow them to receive discounts with participating merchants.

This program provides a Thank A Veteran ID Card issued by the Fort Bend County Clerk's office to those veterans who have filed their DD-214 with this office.

If you recorded your DD-214 prior to the launch of the program, the Fort Bend County Clerk's office can verify your discharge recording and then issue your Thank A Veteran ID Card. Office hours are Monday through Friday, 8 AM - 5 PM, excluding all County holidays. Offices are located in Richmond, Missouri City, Sienna,

Active Military

- · Property Fraud Alert, a free program that monitors documents recorded under your name and alerts you when anything is recorded within the County Clerk's office.
- · Seventy-two hour waiver when applying for a
- · Fees waived if being deployed to a hostile fire zone on these services: (1) certified copy of birth certificate; (2) issuance of marriage license; (3) certified copy of marriage license; (4) fees for transferring title to real or personal property (Government Code 437.217)

Veterans

- · Record military discharge at no fee.
- · Certified copies of recorded military discharge at no fee, if for a veteran benefit
- · Partial waiver of fee for recording an Assumed Name Certificate (DBA), with
- · Property Fraud Alert, a free program that monitors documents recorded under your name and alerts you when anything is recorded within the County Clerk's office.
- · Free certified copies of a document to make or prove a property claim.



Preserving Fort Bend County History

- Continued efforts to digitize Real Property and Vital records.
- Introduced Property Fraud Alert, a **FREE** service that monitors documents recorded in public record under individual, business, or trust names. Currently over 9,500 home and business owners in Fort Bend County have registered and 500 more projected by the end of 2024.
